

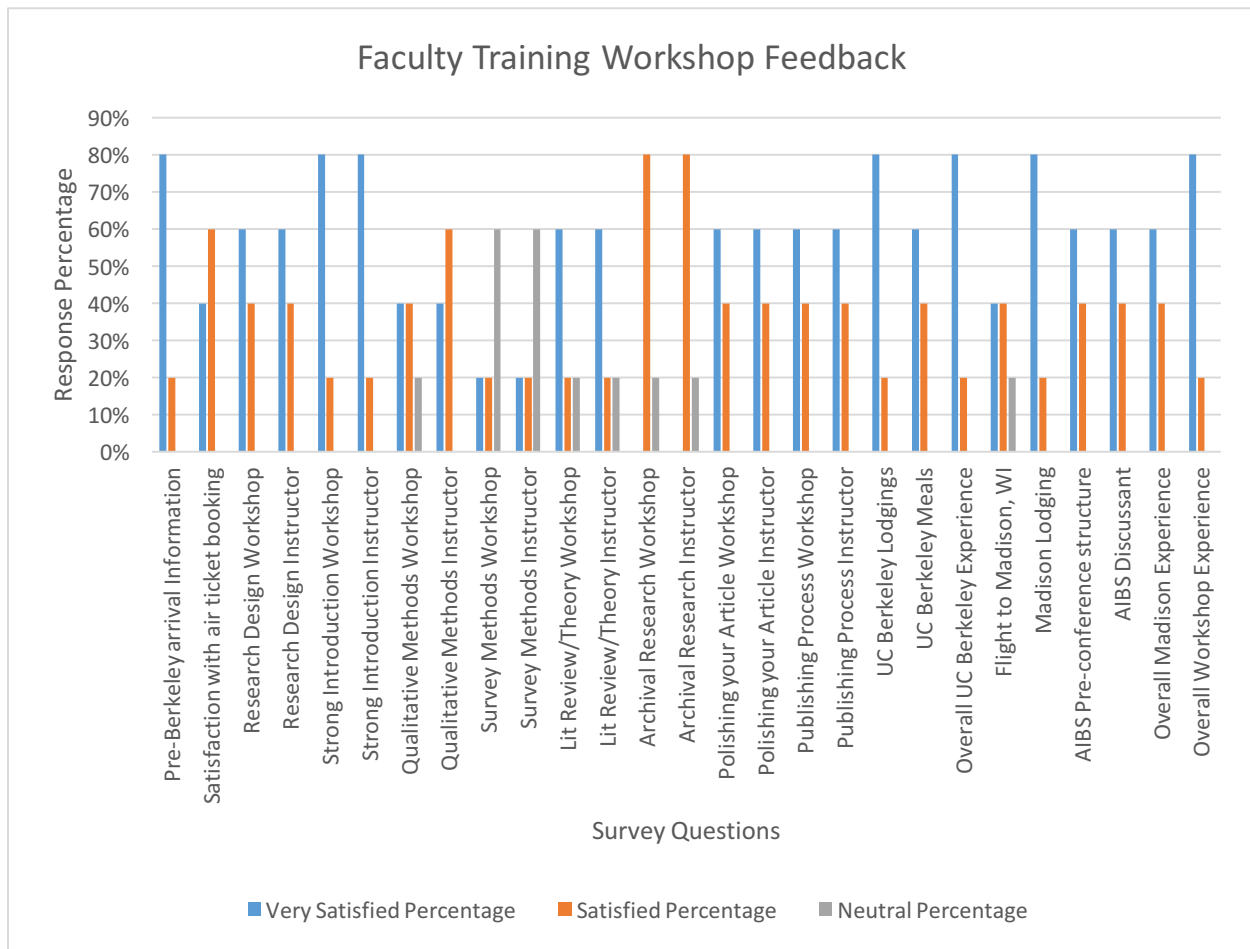
Bangladesh Faculty Training Workshop Feedback

The responses to the quantitative survey questions can be found in the bar graph below. The responses can also be visualized in the succeeding table. Overall, none of the questions received an “unsatisfied” or “very unsatisfied” response. Predominantly, over 90% of the answers to the questions were either “satisfied” or “unsatisfied” with the remainder of the answers being labeled as “neutral”. The majority of the questions regarding the workshops and logistics had 80% of the responses being either “very satisfied” or “satisfied”. It was only the Survey Methods Workshop and the Survey Methods instructors where the attendees felt neutral about the session (60% responded neutral).

However, the majority of the responses were positive and mainly were in the “Satisfied” or “Very Satisfied” responses. The participants did provide useful feedback and comments on the workshop itself. Two respondents mentioned the need for either a longer-term residency or other mechanisms that would allow them to submit/publish the paper while they were here in the U.S. There was also a suggestion to bring someone from the publishing side who can share their views on accepted papers vs rejected papers and how best they could rework their paper. Based off of the archival workshop, participants did ask for a day-long workshop on the archival research methodology and the need to add in hands-on workshops that explored software like “Zotero” and “OneNote”.

All of the participants said that they would recommend the workshop to their colleagues as it helped them “to understand gaps between our thinking, especially theoretical gaps”. This was echoed by another participant who thought it would be useful for his colleagues to “espouse and share their intellectual abilities with Western countries to understand their

academic gaps and to find out where they can contribute in the academic field”. One participant recommended that the whole program be “live streamed” so they can share this knowledge with their universities in Bangladesh.
